- ♥ Armistice Day is on 11 November and is also known as Remembrance Day.
- ♥ It marks the day World War One ended, at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month, back in 1918.
- ♥ A two minute silence is held at 11am to remember the people who have died in wars.



This week, you'll see people on the TV and in the streets wearing a poppy. But what are they for?

Poppies are red flowers which are worn to show others that you are remembering those who died for their country.

The reason poppies are used is because they are the flowers which grew on the battlefields after World War I ended.
